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1. Introduction and Background

- 1.1. This Consultation Statement has been prepared to fulfil the legal obligations of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.
- 1.2. Part 5, Section 15 (2) of the Regulations defines a 'Consultation Statement' as a document which:
 - i. contains details of the persons and bodies who were consulted about the proposed neighbourhood development plan;
 - ii. explains how they were consulted;
 - iii. summarises the main issues and concerns raised by the persons consulted; and
 - iv. describes how these issues and concerns have been considered and, where relevant, addressed in the proposed neighbourhood development plan.
- 1.3. The Great Cransley Neighbourhood Development Plan has been prepared in response to the Localism Act 2011 which gives Parish Councils and other relevant bodies powers to prepare statutory neighbourhood plans (NDPs) to help guide developments in their local areas. Through the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan, local people can shape, direct and help to deliver sustainable development, by influencing local planning decisions as part of the statutory development plan.
- 1.4. The Great Cransley Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (GCNPSG) was established in April 2019. The Steering Group comprised members of the Parish Council and local residents to drive forward the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan and to lead on the public engagement and consultation process.
- 1.5. At the end of a 6 week consultation with residents, May 11th 2015, Great Cransley Parish Council originally applied to Kettering Borough Council (now part of the unitary authority, North Northamptonshire Council) for the designation of the whole of the Parish as a Neighbourhood Plan Area. On 27th May 2015, Kettering Borough Council approved the Neighbourhood Plan Area for Great Cransley.
- 1.6. A Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire for both residents and businesses located in the Parish was the subject of public consultation in Spring 2017. A full report of the survey was published on the Parish Council's website and is provided at **Appendix E** of this Statement.

- 1.7. A draft Plan was shared informally with Officers of North Northamptonshire Council at a meeting in June 2022. Following receipt of detailed comments initially received in September 2022, amendments were made, and a draft was prepared for public consultation.
- 1.8. On Friday 27th September 2024 the Parish Council invited residents from the parish to a 'launch' of the Draft (Pre-Submission) Neighbourhood Plan. This event was held at the Great Cransley Village Hall:
Friday 27th - 11 am to 3 pm and 5 pm to 8 pm
Saturday 28th - 9.30 am to 1.45 pm
Up to 70 residents attended the launch over the two days. Further details of this event are provided in Section 2 of this Statement. An extract of the posters for the launch event is provided in **Appendix B** of this Statement.

1.9. The GCNP Steering Group has sought to undertake appropriate and effective engagement with the local community.

1.10. The aims of the Great Cransley Neighbourhood Development Plan consultation process were:

- i. To involve as much of the community as possible throughout all consultation stages of the Neighbourhood Plan development so that the Plan was informed by the views of local people, businesses and other stakeholders.
- ii. To ensure that consultation events took place at critical points in the process where decisions needed to be taken.
- iii. To engage with a wide range of people as possible, using a variety of methods, communication and consultation techniques.
- iv. To ensure that results of consultation were fed back to residents and available to read (in both hard copy and via the Parish Council website) after consultation events.

2. Consultation Strategy and Process

Publicity

- 2.1. The GCNP Steering Group has used the following to publicise the Neighbourhood Development Plan during the various stages of the Plan's preparation.

Website

- 2.2. A Neighbourhood Plan website greatcransley.co.uk/neighbourhoodplan

Facebook

- 2.3. The Steering Group also have a dedicated Facebook page in regard to the neighbourhood plan (as created on July 25th 2019). This page advertises any notices or articles in respect of the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan. facebook.com/groups/greatcransleyplan

Roadside Banners

- 2.4. A vinyl banner was purchased, attached to a vehicle, and displayed in the following locations across the Parish to advertise the Pre-Submission Consultation of the Neighbourhood Plan.
 - i. Crossroads with Church Lane, Loddington Road and Bridle Way
 - ii. Parking bay adjacent to the village hall on Loddington Road

Posters

- 2.5. Posters were used to publicise surveys, exhibitions and consultations. An example of a poster is provided in **Appendix C** of this Statement.

News

- 2.6. The Parish Council provided monthly updates about the Neighbourhood Plan as part of the Cransley Chronicle newsletter; at the time were delivered to all households in the Parish.

The Steering Group issued and delivered 3 newsletters to every resident in the parish. Examples of updates provided are included in **Appendix D**.

- 2.7. Prior to the public consultation of the Pre-Submission Neighbourhood Plan, leaflets and a goodie bag were distributed to every household in the Parish (between 13th and 22nd September 2024) advising residents of the forthcoming public consultation and details of the public exhibition to be held at Great Cransley Village Hall.

Parish Council Agendas and Minutes

- 2.8. The Neighbourhood Plan was included as a regular item on Parish Council Meeting Agendas. Parish Councillors on the Steering Group provided updates and these were summarised in meeting minutes. Full details are available on the Parish Council website greatcransleyparishcouncil.gov.uk

Surveys and Consultations

- 2.9. The Great Cransley Parish Survey was distributed in 2017 to all households in the Parish **Appendix A**. A summary of the responses to the Parish Survey was published in August 2019 and was provided on the Parish Council website. This summary provides a detailed analysis of the survey both using charts and tables as appropriate. A copy of the report is provided in **Appendix E** of this Statement.
- 2.10. There have been a number of informal consultations during the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan as summarised below:-

3. Pre-Submission Draft Consultation

- 3.1. The Pre-Submission Draft Neighbourhood Plan was tabled for discussion at a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group meeting and members resolved that the plan be agreed to proceed to the Pre-Submission Consultation.
- 3.2. As detailed earlier in this Statement, a launch of the Pre-Submission Draft Neighbourhood Plan was held in the Great Cransley Village Hall from 27th and 28th September 2024. In addition to the display of boards summarising key aspects of the Plan, a slide show was provided in regard to the proposed Local Green Spaces and Important Public Views together with drone footage of the Parish, which was played throughout the event and proved a great draw. As well as the Neighbourhood Plan display material, a Parish history presentation was provided, and a café provided light refreshments for those attending the event.
- 3.3. The Pre-Submission Consultation period ran from 27th September to 8th November 2024, meeting with the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. The Pre-Submission Plan was available to view on the Neighbourhood Plan website greatcransley.co.uk/neighbourhoodplan

- 3.4. Responses to the Pre-Submission Neighbourhood Plan could be made via the following methods:
- an online form via a link from the Neighbourhood Plan website;
 - by completing a hard copy of the response form provided in the goodie bag or downloadable for printing from the Neighbourhood Plan website; or
 - by emailing comments directly to a dedicated Neighbourhood Plan email address greatcransleyplan@gmail.com
- 3.5. An email was sent to the consultation bodies listed in **Appendix G**.
- 3.6. All responses submitted in writing, online or by email were given careful consideration and have been used to inform the Submission Version of the Neighbourhood Plan.

4. Summary of Issues and Concerns and their Treatment in the Plan

4.1. The main issues and concerns raised during consultation with residents and businesses in the Great Cransley Neighbourhood Development Plan Area are summarised in the following table which also shows how they have been addressed in the Neighbourhood Plan

- 4.3. A total of 77 responses and representations were received as a result of the Pre-Submission Consultation. **Appendix F** summarises the responses and sets out the Parish Council’s response and action in relation to each response.

5. Conclusions

- 5.1. This Consultation Statement demonstrates that the Great Cransley Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (acting on behalf of Great Cransley Parish Council) has prepared the Neighbourhood Plan in accordance with the legal obligations as set out in the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012.
- 5.2. All statutory requirements have been met, and a significant level of additional consultation, engagement and research has been carried out. The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has made genuine and committed efforts to engage all those who live, work or have a business interest in the Neighbourhood Area and provided them with every opportunity to influence the content of the Great Cransley Neighbourhood Development Plan throughout its preparation.
- 5.3. This Consultation Statement and supporting appendices have been produced to document the consultation and engagement process undertaken and are considered to comply with Part 5, Section 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012.


